
Das *past simple* für abgeschlossene Ereignisse → S. 59

Das *past simple* wird verwendet, um über Ereignisse zu sprechen, die aus Sicht des Sprechers abgeschlossen sind. Sie können sich vor langer Zeit, aber auch erst vor Kurzem ereignet haben. Bestimmte „Signalwörter“ können das *past simple* auslösen, darunter *ago*, *in the early / late 1990s*, *in 1999*, *when ...*, *once* und *back then*.

Once I climbed a mountain.
I visited New Zealand ten years **ago**.

Das *present perfect* für Erfahrungen mit Bezug zur Gegenwart → S. 62, 63

Das *present perfect* wird verwendet, um über Erfahrungen zu sprechen, die für die Gegenwart noch relevant sind. Das *present perfect* wird häufig durch bestimmte „Signalwörter“ ausgelöst, darunter: *ever*, *never*, *before*, *in your life*.



Have you ever seen a man-eating tiger?
I **have never been** to Los Angeles.
I **have climbed** a mountain *before*.

Bildung des *present perfect* → S. 60

Gebildet wird das *present perfect* aus dem Hilfsverb *have / has* und der Partizipform des gewünschten Verbs. Vgl. Tabelle unregelmäßiger Verben auf den Seiten 205 - 206.

have / has + **been / gone / seen / travelled / visited**

Yet und *already* → S. 61

In Sätzen mit *present perfect* werden *yet* und *already* verwendet, um zu sagen bzw. in Erfahrung zu bringen, dass bzw. ob etwas bereits stattgefunden hat. Während *yet* an Fragen und Verneinungen angehängt wird, findet man *already* in Aussagesätzen.

I have **already** visited a kiwi farm.
I haven't been to Wellington **yet**.
Have you done a guided tour of a winery **yet**?

Der Superlativ → S. 64

Wenn über die besten und größten Erlebnisse im Leben berichtet wird, verwendet man oft den Superlativ. Neben regelmäßigen Formen, die mit *the -est* gebildet werden, gibt es auch unregelmäßige, die auswendig gelernt werden müssen. Bei Adjektiven (z. B. *beautiful*), die aus zwei oder mehr Silben bestehen, wird dem Adjektiv in der Regel *the most* vorangestellt.

The elephant is **the biggest** animal I've ever seen.
